
Robert B. Parker's Fallout: A Jesse Stone Novel





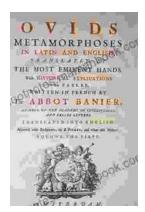
