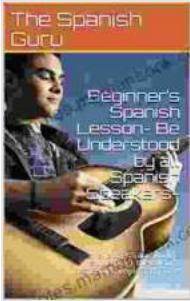

Indicating Reciprocal Actions: *[Pronoun] + se + gustan*

Another fascinating use of *gustarse* is to express reciprocal actions or feelings between two or more people. In this context, it is used in the reflexive form (*se gustan*) and takes a plural pronoun (*nos, os, les*) as its subject.

Examples:

- *Nosotros nos gustamos.* (We like each other.)
- *Vosotros os gustáis.* (You (plural) like each other.)
- *Ellos se gustan.* (They like each other.)
- *¿Se gustan ustedes?* (Do you (formal) like each other?)

Additional Uses and Considerations

In addition to the primary uses mentioned above, *gustarse* can also be employed in the following ways:

- **With indirect object pronouns:** *Me gusta que...* (I like that...)
- **In impersonal constructions:** *Se dice que...* (It is said that...)
- **With the preposition *por*:** *Me gusta por ti.* (I like it because of you.)

It's important to note that *gustarse* always takes an indirect object pronoun (*me, te, se, nos, os, les*) as its subject. The object of the verb is typically a noun, pronoun, or infinitive.

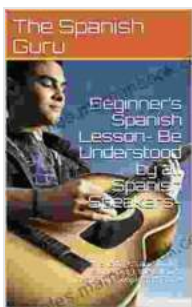

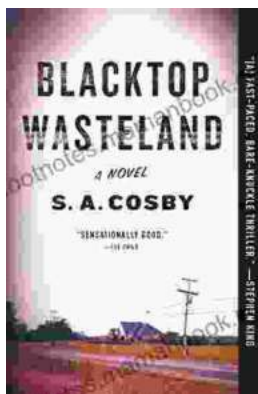

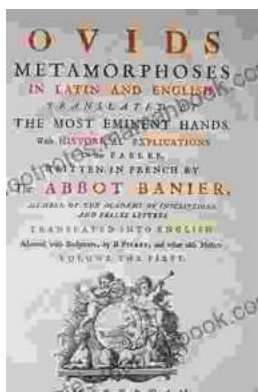
